METROFILE CONTINUES SUPPORT FOR THE EDUCATION SECTOR

August 2014: JSE-listed Metrofile Holdings Limited has provided nearly R800 000 of financial support to various educational institutions in South Africa throughout 2014, as part of its ongoing commitment to support education in the communities in which the company operates.

According to Richard Buttle, Director of Metrofile Holdings Limited, the company invests in the education of individuals, both able and disabled, as Metrofile strongly believes that education is a key component to building a more sustainable future.

One of the main recipients of Metrofile's support is the Sowle Centre in Benoni, Johannesburg, which provides a sound education to children with Down's Syndrome and other special educational needs. Metrofile sponsors the cost of the education and sundry expenses for three children, as well as the education of one child at the Muriel Brand School, a school aimed at empowering children with disabilities.

iKwezi, the flagship education development project hosted by the Schools Development Unit at the University of Cape Town, has also received support from Metrofile to assist in its activities aimed at improving educational outcomes of disadvantaged children in the Western Cape.

In addition, three students attending a private primary school as well as a high school student have also had the cost of their fees covered.

"Ensuring a quality education is provided to the youth of South Africa is a cause the company takes very seriously. In order to address the growing skills shortage and high levels of unemployment in the country, it is necessary to start supporting our youth at a basic level of education," concludes Buttle.
